PEOPLE IN GUYANA WOULD LIKE YOU TO KINDLY ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

Mr. Woods, according to the ExxonMobil Proxy Statement 2021, you got paid US\$15,639,061. That's roughly 2000 times more than the average salary of Guyanese nurses, teachers, and police officers who fight to protect and save lives.

Mr Woods do you agree this is unfair/unjust?

Mr Woods, have you told the ExxonMobil board, shareholders, lenders and investors that the environmental permit for Liza 1 runs out in around 100 days?

Mr Woods, did you even know that?

Mr Woods, the BP Macondo well blowout killed 11 people, spewed out nearly 5 million barrels of oil, covered 40,000 square miles, devastated the Gulf of Mexico and cost BP about US\$65bn.

Mr Woods, can you guarantee that there will never be a well blowout from your operations offshore Guyana?

Mr Woods, Esso Exploration and Production Guyana Ltd. (ESSO) said that its gas compressor is faulty.

Mr Woods why is ExxonMobil's subsidiary using faulty equipment in Guyana?

Mr Woods, have you told the ExxonMobil board, shareholders, lenders and investors about the court cases relating to your operations in Guyana? Do you even know about:

- the challenge to the lopsided Petroleum Agreement?
- the challenge to the petroleum production licence?
- the challenge to Esso's flaring?
- the constitutional challenge to petroleum development?

Mr Woods, when did ESSO start to flare gas, when did ESSO tell the Environmental Protection Agency and how much gas has ESSO flared?

Mr Woods, the environmental impact assessment for Liza 1 says ESSO will dump 4,000 barrels of sewage into Guyana's pristine marine environment every day amounting to 1,411,368,000 gallons for Liza 1.

Mr Woods, how much sewage has Esso Exploration and Production Guyana Ltd dumped in Guyana's waters and where is the sewage coming from?

Mr Woods, what would you say to your great grandchild if s/he came from the future and asked you why you didn't do more to stop the destruction of life on Earth and why you did the opposite instead, and worked for an industry that was directly responsible for destroying the only habitable planet we have?
